Flights are minimal and liable to disruption. It is possible to bring a car on the ferry. An Cridhe and Coll Bunkhouse are located in Arinagour, the main village on the Isle of Coll. It is a 15-minute walk from the ferry terminal. There is no public transport on Coll, should somebody wish to explore the island a car is recommended, however An Cridhe and the Post Office rent out bikes as well.
Accessibility	Coll Bunkhouse and community centre are fully accessible and all ground floor only, with large accessible bathrooms and showers in both buildings. Do note both are accessed via hard packed tracks which during periods of wet
	weather do become scattered with puddles.
Insurance	An Cridhe has Public Liability Insurance. Due to the nature of the Isle of Coll being accessible mainly by ferry (although a flight is available) and these ferries depending on weather, it would be recommended that the artist has travel insurance.

About us	An Lanntair is a hub for creativity and the Arts in the Outer Hebrides. We are a multi arts venue – at one and the same time a contemporary art gallery, a theatre, a cinema, a dance studio, a concert hall, a platform for poetry and literature, a studio – every space stretched to showcase the Arts in multiple forms. Our work stretches across a national and international platform, yet our distinctiveness lies in being 'of the place', rooted in who we are, and the creativity of Gaelic and the Outer Hebrides takes centre stage. Bothy Project, Isle of Eigg

About us	Bothy Project is a unique and independent charity, providing arts residencies in bespoke small-scale, off-grid spaces to explore creativity, landscape and living simply.
	Our solo, off-grid residencies are unique. We welcome practitioners in visual arts, craft and design, music, literature and performance, as well as thinkers, researchers and people local to each bothy.
	Our Public Programme captures experiences and learning generated across residencies and shares it through talks, podcasts and posters.
	Active in Scotland since 2011, Bothy Project was initiated by artist Bobby Niven and architect lain MacLeod, as part of the 2011 RSA Residencies for Scotland Programme. Since then, we have hosted over 400 residencies. Residencies are currently held at Sweeney's Bothy on the Isle of Eigg.

Studio Facilities	Sweeney's Bothy is a modern off grid, live/workspace designed specifically for artists' residencies. It is a comfortable and warm space heated by a wood-burning stove.
	Facilities include a library, desk and chair, mezzanine double bed, kitchenette, wood-burning stove (with hot plate and oven), gas hob, outdoor shower, composting toilet and renewable energy system (electric and hot water).
	The bothy strikes a balance between the priorities for making-thinking-doing and connecting with the surrounding environment. Facilities at the bothy have been designed to support residents' focus and diminish the distractions of digitally connected life. As such there is no Wi-Fi and limited power and phone signal at the bothy.

Costs	Cost of residency at Sweeney's Bothy: £750 per week (subsidised by 25%) Including 7 nights of Bothy accommodation, bedding, firewood, cleaning, transport to/from Eigg pier to Bothy.
Minimum Period	Minimum stay: 1 week. The residency can be split over several visits.
Maximum Period	By negotiation. Sweeney's Bothy is a simple dwelling and we find people enjoy to stay for 1-2 weeks at a time. Longer residencies can be proposed and discussed but we advise splitting a longer residency over a number of visits.

Support Offered	Bothy Project staff will meet with the selected resident (either in-person or online) to provide advice and support regarding the residency. Prior to and during the

	residency, the resident will be supported by Sweeney's Bothy's host who lives on the Isle of Eigg and can connect the resident to Eigg's community and events.
Promotional Support Offered	The RSA residency and artist will be promoted through Bothy Project's website, newsletter and social media platforms.

Cove Park, Argyll and Bute

About us	Cove Park is an international residency centre based on an outstanding 50-acre rural site in Argyll on Scotland's west coast. Our programme of residencies, commissions, and collaborative projects respond to and promote the diversity of contemporary artistic practice. We support artists, creative practitioners, and researchers to develop and produce ambitious, innovative, and ground-breaking new work for audiences and participants across Scotland and beyond. The site - which is on a hillside overlooking Loch Long - is just over one hour northwest of Glasgow and is well served by public transport. Residents can be one of up to 12 individuals taking part in our programme at any one time. The duration and dates of residencies can be agreed in response to the needs and requirements of the artists themselves. Cove Park's residencies are self-catering, and each unit of accommodation has its own kitchen; however, residents are also welcome to use the large communal kitchen in the Jacobs Building, which also includes a library, meeting rooms, and other shared facilities.

Studio Facilities	Cove Park has five brightly lit studios, all c. 16ft x 20ft. Four of the studios have sinks, one has a 60-litre kiln. Residents are allocated their own private studio and have 24-hour access to this space. It is possible to park close to all of the studios.
Costs	Depending upon the accommodation allocated, the weekly cost ranges between £500 to £650.
Minimum Period	2 weeks
Maximum Period	4 weeks
Other Facilities	All residents have 24-hour access to the Jacobs Building on site and its communal facilities, including a library, large open-plan kitchen, dining area, workspaces, meeting room, and laundry. Cove Park's offices have two printers/photocopiers and the Jacobs Building has Wi-Fi.
Support Offered	The RSA resident will be supported fully by Cove Park's Director, Senior Producer, and the wider Cove Park team (on site during weekdays). As with all forthcoming residents, the RSA artist will receive the Cove Park Handbook in advance of their residency and information on the facilities, local amenities, tools, and equipment available. Artists are welcome to contact staff in advance of their residency to discuss specific requirements and to receive support with planning and research. The RSA resident will be welcome (but not obliged) to take part in informal and professional events designed to bring the artists on site together with staff and guests, these can include lunches, dinners, studios discussions, talks, screenings and public events.
Promotional Support Offered	The residency will feature on Cove Park's website, in our monthly Newsletter, and on social media. We will work with the artist on the text for these platforms.
Exhibition or Other Opportunities	Cove Park does not have a dedicated gallery or run a regular programme of exhibitions. The RSA resident will be invited to join Cove Park's Associates programme, which offers residencies and other opportunities for our former residents. If appropriate, former residents can be invited to take part in our

	engagement programme, devising and leading workshops for young people and adults in our local community (this work is paid at SAU rates).
Requirements	N/A
Accommodation Offered	All residents are provided with private accommodation (including shower room, small kitchen, double bed, sitting area, and desk). Parking is available. Cove Park has accommodation suitable for those bringing children (please discuss this with Cove Park directly). Although it is possible to find childcare locally, this can be difficult due to demand and the limited number of childminders on the Rosneath Peninsula).

	Cove Park is accessible by public transport. We are 30 minutes by car or public transport from Helensburgh, our nearest town. It is also possible to come via train from Glasgow Central to meet a ferry crossing from Gourock to Kilcreggan on the Rosneath Peninsula (just 10 minutes by bus or taxi to Cove Park). Cove Park has three e-bikes to support local trips on the Peninsula.
Accessibility	Cove Park has units of accommodation and studios with level access which are suitable for wheelchair users. Cove Park is on a rural hillside and some areas of the site feature rough terrain. The spaces are private and quiet. The Jacobs Building is fully accessible for wheelchair users. It also has baby changing facilities. Support animals are welcome, but the site does have livestock (sheep and Highland cows) and therefore dogs must be kept on a. lead. We invite residents to submit an access statement prior to their residencies and will work to support each participant's specific needs and requirements.
Insurance	Cove Park has public liability insurance but our insurance does not cover residents' travel.



Cromarty Arts Trust, Black Isle

About us	At the Cromarty Arts Trust, a charity founded in 1987, we aim to: - Develop appetite and capacity for cultural creativity in individuals and communities in Cromarty, the Black Isle and across Scotland.
	- To promote the value of creativity and break barriers to participation and interest in all aspects of creative activity.
	- To engage with people at an early stage in their experience of creativity to help stimulate a lifelong interest.
	We run an annual programme of live music, theatre and performance, music and visual arts workshops, and applied craft courses.
	We have three historic buildings in Cromarty, a vibrant coastal conservation town on the tip of the Black Isle peninsula. Cromarty is 1 hour by bus or 40 minutes by car from Inverness.
	Artist accommodation is in a single en-suite room in Ardyne House, a 5 bedroom house with a shared kitchen in the center of Cromarty. The artist studio space is in our converted 18th century Stables building, 20 minutes' walk away from the center of town. The artists' working space is one of the seven bays which originally housed horses. The other six bays are used on a permanent basis by local artists.

Studio Facilities	The artist studio space is in our converted 18th century Stables building, a very quiet rural location surrounded by woodland and fields. The artists' working space is one of the seven bays which originally housed horses.
	The bay is 2.5m x 4m, has Wi-Fi, is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, the artist will have their own key. There is plentiful free parking. The bays are not lockable but the whole studio space is, keys are held by the other 6 artists and CAT staff. There are shared sinks, fridge and kettle. Tables, a chair and a full-sized easel are supplied.
Costs	Total = £2,000.

Other Facilities	Cromarty has two museums, a library, a primary school, an Aberdeen University research station for marine science and many artistic and engaged residents. Our

	welcome dinner gives the artist an opportunity to meet everyone and engage with the community.
Support Offered	There will be a member of CAT staff on hand to support the artist at all times. Our mobile phone numbers are available to the artist. CAT staff will always endeavour to assist with all reasonable requests. Cromarty has good public transport links to Inverness but lifts in our community car share can be helped with.
Promotional Support Offered	We will publicise the artists' residency and work on our website, through our social media and in our e-newsletter. We will promote the end of residency exhibition through these channels and through posters and email invitations.
Exhibition or Other Opportunities	End of residency exhibition/showing of work in either the Stables Gallery or our Old Brewery building, whichever is appropriate to the quantity of work and media used. This is usually a short exhibition at the end of their time here, there will be an opening evening with wine followed by 2 days of open showing, usually 10.30am - 4pm. We would expect the artist to host these two days. This is a chance to show the community what they have been working on, and to sell works if appropriate.

Deveron Projects, Huntly

About us	Deveron Projects is an arts organisation embedded in Huntly, a rural town in north-east Scotland for 30 years.
	We build deep and meaningful collaboration between artists and communities, aiming to tangibly intervene in the complex and urgent issues affecting our town, including climate breakdown and Just Transition, town regeneration, identity and belonging in rural places.
	Our popular regular events, flexible artists' residencies, innovative collaborative projects and valued community resources create connections between people and across differences, making space for mutual learning and activating citizenship. All of our work takes place in public, beyond the confines of a gallery or art centre; from a woodland dedicated to peace, to a climate justice youth group, film clubs to meals, an honesty bakery to a new community space in a disused shopfront on the town square, among over a hundred other projects.
	We look after several well-loved buildings and community resources, including Square Deal community hub, the Artist's House live/workspace, two community gardens, woodlands and libraries.
	ABOUT HUNTLY
	Huntly is a small, former market town of 4,500 people in the heart of north-east Scotland. The town supports a large rural area, equivalent to the AB54 postcode (around 7100 people). We are 40 miles from Aberdeen and 65 miles from Inverness (the nearest cities with galleries, theatres and formal cultural spaces), bound to the north by the River Deveron and to the south by the A96.
	Within easy reach of the town are forests, rivers, farmland and hills. Driving, we are around half an hour from the Moray coast and half an hour from the Cairngorms National Park. There are lots of walks in the local area and it is possible to rent e-bikes from Huntly Development Trust. In town there are all basic amenities, plus a new community cinema and café. There are trains from Huntly to Aberdeen and Inverness.

	Margaret Gardiner's original collection includes works by major 20th Century artists Barbara Hepworth, Ben Nicholson and Alfred Wallis, amongst others, as well as important Orcadian artists such as Sylvia Wishart and Stanley Cursiter. The outstanding collection has grown steadily since 1979 and now comprises over 230 works including contemporary additions by artists such as Jim Lambie, Edmund de Waal and Katy Dove, as well as works by Orcadian artists Steven MacIver and Brandon Logan.
	The Pier Arts Centre's ambitious programme of exhibitions, learning activities and residencies supports its mission to provide inspirational and barrier-free opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds to enjoy, explore, define and create art. The Centre's aim to inspire and connect artists and audiences and to contribute to community well-being expands from the unfolding legacy of its remarkable collection, from its facilities and by the skills and commitment of its staff and volunteers.
	<u>Linkshouse – Orkney Arts Residency</u> is a dedicated residential and creative space on the north-west coast of Orkney's Mainland. It offers a spectacular location for creative endeavour in a unique historic and natural environment.
